

## **Easy Chicken Pot Pie**

Servings: 6

Serving Size: 1/6 of a pie



#### Ingredients:

- 3/3 cup frozen mixed vegetables, thawed
- 1 cup cooked chicken, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 (1034 ounce) can low fat, condensed, cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup baking mix
- ½ cup skim milk
- legg

#### **Directions:**

- Wash hands and any cooking surfaces.
- Pre-heat oven to 400 degrees F.
- Mix vegetables, chicken and soup in ungreased, 9inch pie plate
- Stir baking mix, milk and egg in a mixing bowl with fork until blended. Pour over vegetables, chicken and soup mixture in pie plate.

  Bake 30 minutes or until golden brown.
- Let cool 5 minutes and serve.
